

Quarter Line Dressage Local Show Information Guide

Description of Expenses:

- ✓ Daily fee for schooling and onsite presence at event is paid by competitor and varies with the number of competitors traveling with QLD
- ✓ QLD staff onsite (grooming & cleaning) if requested by competitors will be a shared expense of the competitors
- ✓ Trailering fee is paid by competitor for horses that are hauled by QLD
- ✓ Entry fee is the responsibility of the rider

Pre Show Responsibilities between Competitor & QLD:

- ✓ Documents required – Health certificate if out of state show and current negative EIA (coggins) need to be provided to QLD prior to event and will be printed and stowed in vehicle for transportation
- ✓ Tack - packing and cleaning of tack that is not the property of QLD is the responsibility of the competitor. Depending on the number of horses traveling tack may need to be transported in the vehicle of the competitor.
- ✓ Feed & Supplements – Feed will be packed by QLD for each horse
- ✓ Fan – Fans are the responsibility of the competitor and must be 3-prong outlet fans, no two prong box fans as many facilities don't allow these due to fire hazard
- ✓ Tack trunk – packing of tack trunks in the responsibility of the competitor, and can be hauled in QLD trailer if space allows. Please pack only what is necessary to avoid extra weight.
- ✓ Hay – Hay will be packed by QLD on QLD trailer or arranged onsite if available
- ✓ Cleaning of Trailer – Trailer will be cleaned and bedded by QLD staff
- ✓ Loading of Trailer – Competitor is responsible for being onsite to load trailer and wrap horse if required, unless arrangements are made in advance.
- ✓ At least one competitor will volunteer to follow trailer as chase car for emergencies if needed

Arrival at Show Facilities

- ✓ If available at least one competitor will travel ahead of the group to open bales of shavings and bed stalls, and hang water buckets
- ✓ Competitors will help with unloading of horses, tack trunks, hay & feed and setting up of community tack stall. (Unless workers are traveling with QLD this is the responsibility of ALL competitors)
- ✓ Warm up rides will be scheduled for all horses competing; it is the responsibility of the competitor to tack & groom unless grooms are traveling with QLD

Show Day Responsibilities

- ✓ Braiding of the horse is the responsibility of the competitor – many facilities have braiders available as does QLD – please make arrangements in advance.

- ✓ Mucking of stalls is the responsibility of the competitor unless workers are traveling with QLD
- ✓ Watering of horses is the responsibility of the competitor
- ✓ Feeding of horses is the responsibility of the competitor
- ✓ It is suggested that competitors schedule feedings to ease the burden of all
- ✓ Night checks can be performed by onsite services if available. Competitor is responsible for the additional fee.
- ✓ Grooming and tacking is the responsibility of the competitor unless a groom has been arranged in advance and competitor will incur additional fee for service
- ✓ Onsite snacks and water for Market, staff and competitors should be arranged in advance and the responsibility designated prior to the competition.

Ride Times & Warm Up

- ✓ It is the responsibility of the competitor to check ride times the evening before competition
- ✓ Ride times will be posted on community board for all competitors
- ✓ Warm up times will be posted for all competitors; warm up consists of 15 +/- min of prep per ride. This doesn't include your walk warm up. If your horse requires a longer warm up to be ready BEFORE schooling factor that into your prep time.
- ✓ Understand that in the case that there are multiple arenas, ride times may overlap and schooling times may need to be earlier with walk time factored in before the class

Post Show Responsibilities

- ✓ Tear down of the aisle and tack stall is a community event; all competitors will help with packing
- ✓ Loading of Trailer – Competitor is responsible for being onsite to load trailer and wrap horse if required, unless arrangements are made in advance.
- ✓ At least one competitor will be assigned to follow the trailer in case of emergencies
- ✓ Competitors will help with unloading of horses, tack trunks, and remaining feed unless arrangements have been made for QLD staff to be onsite
- ✓ Cleaning of the trailer is the responsibility of the QLD staff
